## Applying for a Place at Sneinton C of E (Aided) Primary School.

Thank you for your interest in applying for a place for your child in this school.

This is a Church of England Aided School. As a result, the admission procedure is different from most other schools.

The school has no catchment area so all children have to apply before being offered a place.

The Governing Body is in charge of admissions. The Governors carefully consider each application and offer places up to a maximum of 30 children per school year group.

In order to be fair to all applicants, the Governors publish their Admission Criteria.

These are used, in the order they are written, to fill the first thirty places in each year group and to put names on the waiting list in priority order.

The attached Application Form is designed to help parents give the Governors as much information as possible. Do not worry if there are some sections which do not apply to you - leave them blank.

However, it is very important that you give the Governors all the information you can so that they know all the background to the application.

If you require any help completing the form, the Head Teacher will be pleased to help you.

Late applications will be considered by the Governing Body at other times. If the Year Group is already full, the Governors are obliged to refuse a place.

Parents may appeal against the decision and/or be placed on a waiting list if requested.

Please note that there is no formal appeal against decisions concerning places in the Nursery.

If you wish your child to be considered for a place, please fill in the attached application form giving the Governors as much information as possible.
