

All Together: Terms of Reference



What is the All Together Programme?

The All Together Programme is a whole-school anti-bullying programme for schools in England.

It is funded by the [Department for Education](#) and delivered by the [Anti-Bullying Alliance](#) with support from [Achievement for All](#), [Contact](#), and the [Council for Disabled Children](#).

What is an All Together School?

An 'All Together School' is a school that has been recognised for its work to reduce bullying and improve the wellbeing of its pupils over the course of the All Together Programme.

Being awarded All Together School status does not imply that bullying never takes place at that school. The Anti-Bullying Alliance and the programme partners do not have oversight of, or responsibility for, the ongoing practice of schools who have been awarded.

Guidelines for using the All Together School logo



Who can use the All Together School logo?

- The All Together School logo is available for use to schools that have achieved Bronze, Silver or Gold All Together School status.
- Schools receive a logo that indicates the status they have achieved (Bronze, Silver or Gold)
- The use of the logo cannot be transferred to a third party.

How to use the All Together School Logo

- The logo can be used on websites, headed papers and other relevant materials (school displays, charters, posters, etc.) by schools that have been awarded their Bronze, Silver or Gold status.
- The logo can only be used and reproduced in the format provided – neither the colour nor shape can be altered.
- The logo can only be used to demonstrate the school's level of success on the All Together Programme rather than an endorsement of any other specific materials or activity.
- Schools must only use the logo that represents the status they have achieved (Bronze, Silver or Gold).
