The journey to become a school council representative starts with nominations. Children then have the opportunity to talk about why they would be the right candidate for their class, we then we hold elections. The school council representatives are voted for by their class peers and each class has 2 representatives.

We hold school council meetings twice a half term where the council representatives bring any ideas or views to the meeting for us to discuss. We can meet with school leaders and other members of staff to help improve the school and enable all children's voice to be heard.

School Council representatives develop their personal skills, social awareness and they grow in confidence in Oracy, as they learn to express their views constructively.

- Developing access for pupil voice
