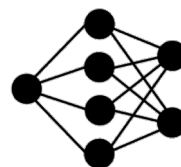

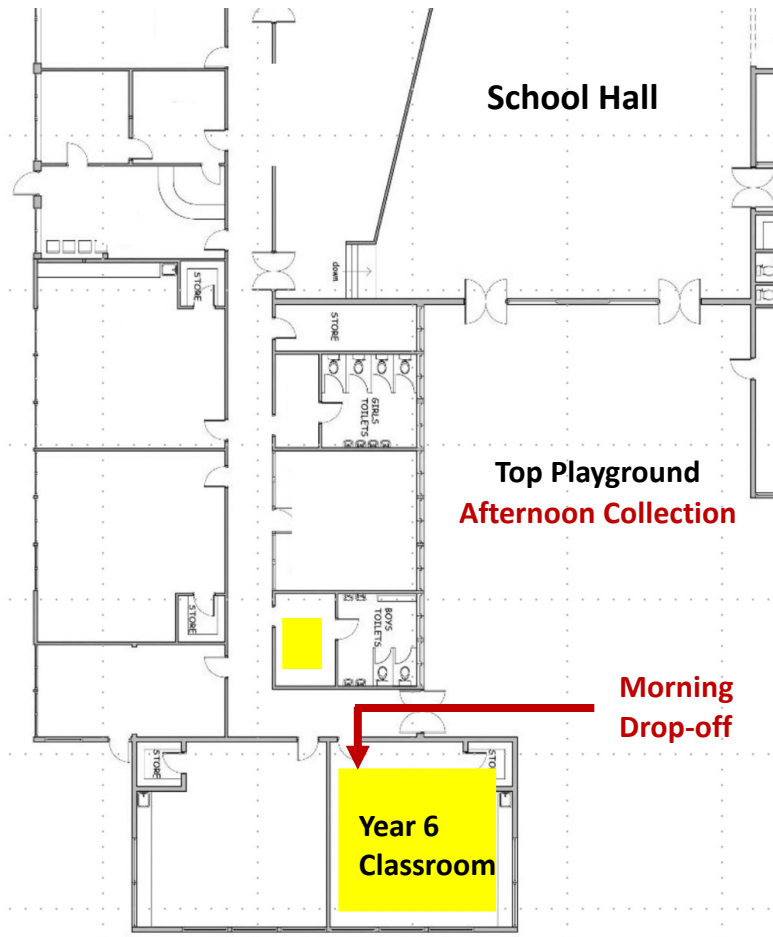

Children enter school through the Key Stage 2 steps and make their way to their classroom.

At the end of the day, the children will stand with their class teacher on the top playground, where you will be able to collect them. In Year 6, children may walk home on their own, with signed permission from their parent/carer. Any younger children will still need to be collected by an adult or family member over 16 years old.



School Uniform

We use Class Dojo for Y1-Y6 as a tool in school for teaching staff to communicate with families, and to celebrate achievements throughout the day.

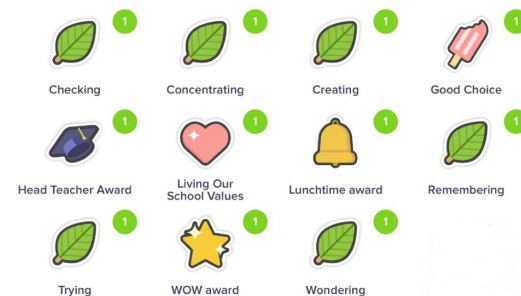
How does Class Dojo work?

- You will need to download the app and create an account. If you already have an account, log in and enter your child's code, which you can get from the office.
- All classes will show on your app as the name of the class (for example: Class 1).
- If you would like to message a member of staff, you will see these listed as 'Professors'. Just click on the Professor and this will send a message to the class team.

Class Dojo is only used during the school day, not outside of school hours. Please refrain from using Dojo to ask about lost property or reading books. We appreciate your co-operation with this.

If there are any concerns you wish to discuss with the class team, then please make an appointment with the member of staff(s) themselves or make an appointment via the office.

We are happy to meet with you in person to discuss any concerns.



Christian Distinctiveness

As a Church of England school, we are proud to of our Christian Distinctiveness. Our values, mission and vision aim to live out the Church of England vision for Education.

In their daily Collective Worship and R.E. lessons, our children learn about the Christian faith and other world faiths. In developing their own spirituality, our children will learn how to share their opinions and beliefs and to respect those of others. As well as their taught R.E. sessions, there is time daily time for reflection, worship and prayer.

Over the course of their journey at Sneinton, our children will attend education visits to various places of worship and participate in themed days to enhance their learning. This is an essential part of the children's curriculum as it encourages tolerance and appreciation of all faiths, as well as inter-faith understanding.



We have four school values that we celebrate and aim to develop in ourselves as a community: love, joy, hope and unity. The children will learn Bible stories that highlight these values and we look for these in our lessons too.

Children are rewarded for living out our school values both on Class Dojo and in our weekly merit assembly.

Behaviour for Learning

Pupils need to have good learning behaviour to be successful. They need to develop the strategies and skills to learn so that they are then able to apply them across the curriculum. This empowers them to become successful life-long learners, to raise their self-esteem and to follow areas of interest and ultimately to be happy and successful adults.



In every classroom, there is a learning tree with six branches. The learning tree branches represent skills the children need to use in order to learn.

Throughout lessons, we ask children to reflect on which branch they need to use to help them succeed. The children are awarded positive Dojos for demonstrating these skills.

Home Learning Expectations

Each week, your child will be given key skills to practise at home. With your support in encouraging your child to practice these, together, we can successfully ensure children master important skills to fluency. This will enable them to flourish in their learning:



Children will be given a colour banded reading book and a reading for pleasure book.

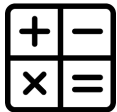
They should practise reading four times each week and record this in their reading record diary.



Practise handwriting to form all letters correctly and fluently:



Learn the meanings of, and how to spell their weekly word list



Practise their arithmetic questions to develop strong number sense.

Using Technology

In Key Stages 1 and 2, children are extremely fortunate to have access to their own iPad, stylus and headphones to use in their learning. We believe that this enables our children to access learning in deeper and more meaningful ways.

iPads are used in the same way as their books through the use of the app Showbie, where teachers can see and mark work through voice notes and in other accessible ways.

Technology is extremely valuable and therefore we expect children to look after this equipment and be proud, safe and respectful digital citizens. We refer to our school behaviour policy when using iPads and our 'iPad Agreement' is in every classroom.

Being safe is an important part of this, and we teach online safety through the curriculum, but also have more information about it for parents too – just scan the QR code below to find out more.
