



Dear parents and Carers,

Class Dojo is a tool we use in school to celebrate the achievements throughout our day. We are making some changes to the way we use Class Dojo at school as of Monday 2nd December. We wanted to inform you of these changes, to make you aware of how Dojo will be used in the future.

- All classes will still show on your app as the name of the class (for example: Class 3).
- Each class will become a 'team' so that any members of staff that work within that class will have access to the same account.
- If you are using the messaging facility on Class Dojo to contact a member of staff in school, this will be sent to the class team, and any member of staff in the team will receive the message. Sharing of information will be monitored by the leadership team throughout the year.
- Class Dojo will only be used during the school day, not outside of school hours.
- Please refrain from using Dojo to ask about lost property and reading books. We appreciate your co-operation with this.
- If there are any concerns you would like to discuss with the class team, then please make an appointment with the member of staff(s) themselves, or make an appointment via the office. We are happy to meet with you in person to discuss any concerns.

Sneinton Charter

The school will:
